HELP FROM OLD GIRLS

THE main purpose to which the Eveline Old Girls' Association devotes itself is raising funds to provide bursaries for girls leaving the school to further their education, whether it be at a university, at a school of ballet, or a technical college.

Every year the committee of the association organises a morning market, jumble sale and other money-making efforts to raise at least \$200 (and it is usually about \$400), which is divided into two bursaries of \$100 each, and a number of smaller ones.

In some cases, when an award is made, it continues to be paid to the recipient until she has completed her course.

10-YEAR EFFORT

The association has raised funds for these bursaries for the past 10 years.

An Old Girl and former teacher at the school, Miss Helen Harvie, also established a bursary fund, and the interest from this is paid out as well.

In 1965 the Old Girls were invited by the association to help the school by donating some chairs for the Allan Welsh Hall. Each chair cost £5 and bore a plaque giving the name of the donor.

The association keeps members in touch with each other and the school by means of a monthly luncheon and an annual reunion diner.
