CRICKET.

This has been a disappointing term. All last year's team are with us, but only Lewis and Peiser can be said to have improved; some have even gone back in form. It is not difficult to see the reason: practices have been badly neglected, and mostly aimless, few have resolved either to enjoy or to profit by them. And for this there is no excuse; the one net pitch is neither accurate nor completed, but it is more than we had last year. Further, Van Rooyen has done his duty well in attending and helping the practices; he would have received more assistance if there had been less pitch-making and general work to be done.

The matches against the clubs produced the best cricket on the part of the school, except that countless runs were given away in the field in various ways. In these games good bowling was often played with a certain amount of thoroughness which gained the success it deserved.

The match against St. George's school was remarkable for the inability of the "tail" of our boys to do anything noteworthy; and for the dependence of the St. George's team upon the efforts of Walsh, though special mention should be made of the invaluable assistance he got from Thomson, when they looked like coming out for under 100; in the same way Lewis, for us, helped to stop a bad run of

disaster. We observed also William's utter unreadiness for the first ball of each innings; his very creditable emergency wicket keeping, a better placing of the field, and the absence of two of our team owing to a cloudy sky.

The second XI. have played two matches, and have, considering their limited opportunities, shown more keenness than some of their betters. In other games Standard V. have organised their forces to some purpose, and usually have the best turn-out of the week.
